Notice of Temporary Variance associated with RFM Chain of Custody Certification Audit Processes

Variance Notification to Certification Bodies

A decision has been taken by the CSC Executive Committee to allow a temporary standard variance for specific subcontractor clauses, under specific circumstances, until a new formal permanent standard change is issued.

The reason for the variance is to allow simple subcontractor processes to be risk assessed before determining the need for full certification for the subcontractor.

The CSC team will offer online training to CBs on request on these variances and to interested relevant parties.

Variance to Standard/Clauses:

Unified Responsible Fisheries Management (RFM) Chain of Custody Standard. Issue 2.5 December 2021.

Ref: 1.7 Where the Applicant utilizes the services of a subcontractor (carrying out contract processing, packaging, or labelling activities), the Subcontractor shall be certified to the RFM Chain of Custody Standard.

Ref: 5.8 Where a Multi-site Organization utilizes the services of a subcontractor (carrying out contract processing, packing or labelling activities), the subcontractor shall be certified to the RFM Chain of Custody Standard.

Effective Date: The effective date shall be one week from the date of publication of this

notice.

Expiration Date: This Variance will be kept under continuous review and will incorporated

into the next version of the General Certification Requirements, and will

expire on the effective date of that version.

The Variation -amendment to clauses:

- 1.7 Where the Applicant utilizes the services of a subcontractor (carrying out contract processing, packaging, or labelling activities), certification of the Subcontractor to the RFM Chain of Custody Standard may not be required under certain circumstances.
- 5.8 Where a Multi-site Organization utilizes the services of a subcontractor (carrying out contract processing, packing or labelling activities), certification of the subcontractor to the RFM Chain of Custody Standard may not be required under certain circumstances.

In all circumstances the Certification Body shall require the client to provide details of how the client will retain full control of each subcontractor.

The Circumstances that DO NOT require subcontractor to be certified to the RFM Chain of Custody Standard include:

In circumstances where:

The subcontractor does not take legal ownership of the intended certified seafood.

And

• The subcontractor is a storage/transporter/distributor of product in its final packaging prior to consumer sale.

Or

A remote assessment of the subcontractor has been carried out to determine that there
are adequate controls in place to ensure that non-certified product cannot be
misrepresented as certified product.

Applicant Requirements:

- The Applicant requiring RFM CoC certification shall maintain an accurate and up-todate list of details of all subcontractors that it uses for handling certified product and provide this to the Certification Body including:
 - Subcontractor entity legal name and address
 - The address of the site(s) (if different from the above) where subcontracting activity(ies) occur.
 - A description of the activity(ies) carried out at the site(s) on certified or intended to be certified product (refer to Table 1 for a list of descriptions).
- The Applicant shall provide the Certification Body sufficient documentation concerning the subcontractor to allow a remote risk assessment to be conducted including the information as per Table 1.
- The Certification Body shall ensure that there is sufficient documentation to confirm that the Applicant meets the requirement of certification in accordance with Sections 1- 4 of the RFM CoC Standard.

Multi-site CoC Applicants:

• the additional requirements of sections 5, 6 and 7 concerning the sub-contractor(s) that handle certified product.

For all Applicants:

- New subcontractors and changes to the circumstances of existing subcontractors (scope of activities, new sites, change of site) shall be provided by the Applicant in advance to the Certification Body prior to handling of certified product by that subcontractor.
- Where the outcome of the remote assessment conducted by the Certification Body is above an acceptable risk threshold (as determined by the Certification Body, the Certification Body shall perform an on-site audit* of the sub-contractor, in accordance with the requirements of the RFM CoC Standard.
- In the cases, where an on-site audit of the sub-contractor is determined, the Applicant shall be informed in advance of the Subcontractor activity (ies) taking place.
- An audit date shall be determined and provided to both the Applicant and the Subcontractor representative.
- An audit does not require a separate Application from the subcontractor unless the subcontractor requests separate RFM CoC certification.
- Where findings are raised at the onsite audit at the subcontractor, corrective action evidence shall be provided in advance of the Applicant utilising the subcontractor for the handling of certified product.
- Where the remote assessment conducted by the Certification Body is below the maximum risk threshold, the Applicant may proceed to use the services of the subcontractor for handling certified product without an onsite audit.
- The Certification Body shall provide written confirmation to the Applicant of the outcome of remote assessments on subcontractors and maintain a record of all subcontractors used by Applicants including the outcome of each subcontractor remote assessments.
- The Applicant shall be responsible for the Certification Body costs associated with the subcontractor audit unless a separate RFM CoC certification audit is requested by the subcontractor. In this event, costs shall be decided between the Applicant and subcontractor and the CB shall confirm the entity responsible for cost and the certificate holder, on eventual certification.

^{*}an onsite audit of a subcontractor does not constitute a certification audit.
